#### **Waterloo Festival (June 2020)**

The Waterloo Festival is now planning to be an 'on-line' event. We will not be performing (live) as planned. However, we are keen to get involved by creating a suitable 'on-line' submission. The theme for 2020 is "Transforming Communities". Here are some ideas and requests for help:

1. Create an on-line Blog about Nonesuch Orchestra

- This could be simple text or a video blog of our history, our purpose and our accomplishments in the community
- Could be a video of an interview with Q&A
- Could be more complex if someone can 'cut & splice' and edit material so we could include things like the interview, photos, videos of performances and articles from our school workshops.
- 2. Create a Virtual Performance of Nonesuch playing the Pachelbel's Canon
  - Basically, everyone films themselves playing their allocated part to a metronome
  - Your video clip is blended with everyone else's clips to create the final performance
  - It needs some care as everyone must play at the same speed, create a good video and audio recording and meet specific deadlines.
  - o It needs project managing and must be completed by end of May.
  - o May require a trial with a smaller group before involving everyone!
- 3. Other ideas from you? They must be ideas that we can execute and complete by the end of May.

Can anyone cut&splice material to create an interesting Video Blog? Does anyone have the technical skills to create a 'virtual performance'?

Is there a volunteer to 'project manage' a virtual performance, requiring deep attention to detail to instruct individuals to create and film their contribution that can be collated together to create the final performance?
