Review of Our Current Activity

In our last three sessions we've been working through the first few pages of the Bartok Divertimento in 'sectionals' during our Virtual Tea Breaks each Thursday morning on zoom. Our aim is to hold another Play Day in the Summer, once lockdown restrictions are lifted, and spend the day working through the entire piece in person. More about this will be shared when it's organised.

We've almost completed our other musical project which was to create a 'virtual performance' of "On The Move" by Robin Wedderburn. More news on that when it's completed.

Finally our 'virtual schools composition workshop' is making progress with ten submissions of new works by young composers.

Looking Ahead

Moving forward we are going to modify our workshop schedule to concentrate on the Bartok at 2weekly intervals. This will allow time for us to all look at the music, practise the parts with the directions we've heard in the workshops, and embed the new disciplines in a more leisurely manner that will bring us to our 'peak' at the time we can physically meet to read through it.

In between the Bartok workshops, our virtual tea breaks will revert to a mix of on-line social activity and information sharing.
